

Offers Industrial Maintenance Opportunities

The western Pennsylvania based ELLWOOD Group this year announced several opportunities for students looking to enhance their training and development in key areas of industrial manufacturing. Scouting is Alive & Well in Lawrence County!



Youth in our community can enjoy the benefits of Scouting. Boy Scouts of America now includes both boys *AND* girls in all their programs, from Kindergarten through 12th grade. At the elementary school level, boys and girls can join a Family Pack with Cub Scouts of America (K-5), learning the basics of Cub Scouting and the fundamentals of leadership.

The Cub Scout Pack is made up of the Lion (Kindergarten), Tiger (1st grade), Wolf (2nd grade), Bear (3rd grade), Webelo (4th grade) and Arrow of Light (5th grade) dens, each focusing on outdoor and leadership skills for boys and girls by grade level.




Phil Riggs, Automotive Tech, Department Chair
